When you think of Mardi Gras, vibrant images of parades and beads in New Orleans may come to mind. But did you know Mobile, Alabama, is America's first Mardi Gras city? The Port City's connection to this festive season runs deep. Mardi Gras, or "Fat Tuesday," stems from French Catholic tradition, marking the final day of feasting before Lent begins on Ash Wednesday. Mobile's ties to France date to its 1702 founding by French explorers Pierre and Jean-Baptiste Le Moyne. In 1703, just a year later, Mobile hosted America's first Mardi Gras celebration. Early Mardi Gras celebrations were simple, with settlers gathering for feasts. By 1711, Mobile introduced its first parade-like tradition with the Boeuf Gras, or "Fatted Ox." In 1866, Joe Cain revived Mardi Gras by leading a parade as "Chief Slacabamorinico," uplifting spirits after the Civil War. His efforts inspired mystic societies, which now organize elaborate parades and balls.

Today, Mobile's Mardi Gras is family-friendly, featuring dazzling floats, marching bands, and the throwing of Moon Pies, a uniquely Mobile treat. The Mobile Carnival Museum showcases the history behind this celebration.

As Mardi Gras season approaches, let's celebrate Mobile's role as the birthplace of this beloved tradition and a source of community pride.

 Pressure Pressure Prescription Tips February is American Heart Month, and blood pressure is an important aspect of heart health. Prescription medication is a common treatment for high blood pressure, a condition that affects nearly half of the adults in the U.S. These tips can help the medicine be most effective: Have a routine; taking the medication around the same time each day will decrease the chances of forgetting a dose. Follow prescription directions, including duration of medication. Feeling better? Blood pressure reading normal? The medicine is doing its job; make sure to continue taking it as directed. Check and record blood pressure often. Taking your pulse rate is never a bad idea, either. The Story of Jack Kent Walters



Born in the Appalachian hills of West Virginia, Jack Walters grew up with a strong sense of duty, which led him to join the Air Force in 1947. Jack served his country with distinction for two decades, retiring in 1967 after a globe-spanning career. It was during his early years of service that Jack met Bobbye, the love of his life. Their paths crossed at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base in 1949, and by December 31, they were married, embarking on a life of adventure and devotion.

In 1952, Jack was stationed in Châteauroux, France. During this time, Bobbye and their young son, Bill, temporarily moved in with her parents in Mobile, Alabama, before joining Jack mid-year. It was also in Châteauroux that their second child, a daughter named Carol, was born in May 1953.

In April 1954, the family relocated to Barksdale Air Force Base, Louisiana, where they stayed until the summer of 1960. From there, Jack was stationed at Andersen Air Force Base, Guam, from 1960 to the summer of 1962. Subsequent assignments included Whiteman Air Force Base, Missouri (1962–1963), Westover Air Force Base, Massachusetts (1963–1965), and the Pentagon in Virginia (1965–1967).

After retiring from the Air Force, Jack moved his family to Mobile, Alabama, in 1968. In 1975, they relocated to Ft. Walton Beach, Florida, where Jack and Bobbye spent many happy years until her passing in 2005. Jack eventually returned to Mobile in April 2022, reconnecting with the community he's always cherished. Jack's love for storytelling and humor remains a cornerstone of his personality. Whether he's recounting tales of his youth or sharing his passion for Alabama college football, Jack brings joy to those around him. His intelligence and quick wit have kept him mentally sharp, and he continues to inspire everyone with his remarkable journey.

Jack's story is one of enduring love, service, and resilience. It's a reminder of the strength of commitment—to country, to family, and to living a life filled with purpose and joy.
